Dear Walter:

You will recall that the Wayne State student newspaper, the south end, advertised a demonstration to be conducted by D. R. U. M. at the Chrysler headquarters in Highland Park on Thursday, October 24.

In addition to the publicity given the demonstration by the south end and D. R. U. M., the Youth Socialist Alliance (the Art and Edith Fox group) distributed three leaflets at the Dodge plant advertising the rally.

An accurate report on their efforts is as follows:

The demonstration was conducted between 3:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. in front of the Main Building and at 5 p.m. on Oakland. A total of 49 people were present most of the time; at peak there were 83 present. There were 34 white males, 34 black males, 9 white females, and 6 black females. The picket signs which they carried read: "Black Power Support D. R. U. M." and "Chrysler Benefits from War and Racism." There were no signs mentioning the U. A. W.
